From the Parish Council

Welcome to our May Newsletter. As I write the sun is shining and that icy chill has abated, at least during the day, although temperatures are still plummeting by night making summer planting very risky...hopefully this will change soon.

The passing of HRH Prince Philip was very sad, even if inevitable, he was a visionary and showed great humanity through his long life. He was also extremely accomplished and leaves a huge legacy; not least The Duke of Edinburgh Award Scheme which has had a lasting impact on the lives of thousands of young people over many years. Our heartfelt sympathies go out to his family, and HRH Queen Elizabeth in particular, who has lost her beloved husband and consort.

We have the local elections being held on Thursday 6th May and the Memorial Hall will be open for you to cast your vote, unless of course you opted for the postal route. Covid-19 precautions will be in operation, so please remember your mask and pen.

Moving on to the Parish Councils update of what's happening in Hempton:-

Roundabout

Due to the pre-election period known as 'purdah' the planning application has been delayed until after the elections. We will put a post on the website and Facebook when the application becomes available.

Duckpond Area

Some young shrubs have been planted close to the coppiced willow tree. But supply of the specific grass seed identified for the site is not available to purchase at present. This means that the sowing may now have to wait until the end of the summer. We will continue to take the advice of the specialists and keep you updated. The Highways Department have been out to clear the blockage that was causing some localised flooding. We await the outcome of their efforts.

Memorial Hall

Those who use the hall on regular basis will know that rainwater pools at the entrance gates. A contractor will be undertaking works to 'cure' the problem. This work is scheduled to commence in June and the work should take approximately 3-4 days. An alternative temporary entrance/exit will be in operation.

From the Holy Trinity Church

Fr Andrew writes....

By the time you read this, Easter will be over. Or will it?

It is so easy to think of the great Christian Festivals as events which happen on a particular day, and then are over with for another year. Easter was on 4th April, well back into last month. Last year we were not allowed to celebrate it publicly – thankfully, this year we were, and what beautiful flowers we had in Holy Trinity Church to help us do so. We were glad to rejoice at Christ's Resurrection, and enjoy the feast and Holy day (and holiday)? Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

But does Easter, or indeed any festival, simply happen; can it simply be enjoyed 'On the day' only? I hope not. If so, then we surely live only for the day, and ultimately, we would we lose any continuity in our lives. Life is after all, a series of events, one controlling or being controlled by another: it is not a series of completely unconnected things - or at least if it is, then it is a sad life indeed.

Easter Day in particular is the beginning of a new part of the Church's year; it is so important that its celebration continues for 50 days. It seems almost too obvious to state that it is Eastertide!

Yes, it continues until the end of its season, when we celebrate the great Feast of the Holy Spirit on the day of Pentecost (Whitsunday), 23rd May. Don't panic - Trinity Sunday is the Sunday after Pentecost, 30th. This will be my first year in Hempton at Holy Trinity Church, and I am hopeful we might manage some special celebration: I enjoy a celebration – who doesn't?!

Celebrations cause us to remember. We like to remember. We naturally remember Prince Philip at this time, and others who have gone before us. Their lives are celebrations, too, of course. Prince Philip always remembered Christ's words, as we should, 'I will not leave you comfortless'. We remember the Risen Lord appeared to the Disciples, gave them His peace, and said to them, 'Receive the Holy Spirit' - on the day of his resurrection. We remember how God had breathed into the first man to give him life - now He breathed into man again to give him new life.

Then He charged them with action – to go and tell, to share with others the Good News, the Gospel, of the Risen Lord. Thus, his work was to continue, by those disciples, by others all through the ages – even down to us. It always amazes me: God's work was entrusted to man! We might have faith in Him – but what faith He has in us.

It's no wonder we need fifty days to celebrate Easter!

This year that's May – but wait, there's more, in this merry month of May.

May is also the month which the faithful have dedicated to Mary, Our Blessed Lady, Queen of Heaven. During this month Christians, both in church and in the privacy of their homes, offer up to Mary from their hearts an especially fervent and loving homage of prayer and veneration.

This Christian custom of dedicating the month of May to the Blessed Virgin arose at the end of the 13th century, when the Church took over various secular feasts which were wont to take place at that time. As one old madrigal puts is, 'Now is the month of maying, when merry lads are playing' – better not go there!!

The Blessed Virgin Mary was the Mother of Our Lord, is the Mother of the Church, and therefore the example, as well as the guide and inspiration, of everyone who, in and through the Church, seeks to be the servant of God and man, and the obedient agent of the promptings of the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit [see above] is the soul of the Church. All the activity and service of its members, beginning with the supreme participation of the Blessed Mother in the work of the Church, is vivified by the Holy Spirit as the body, in all its activities, is vivified by its soul. The Holy Spirit is the great Comforter which Christ Himself sent to be our consolation in the sorrowful mysteries of life, our source of moderation in the joyful mysteries of life, our added principle of exaltation in the glorious mysteries of life.

So, he was for the Blessed Mother; so also, He is for the least of us; so also He is for the rest of the Church, even for those who are its unconscious but conscientious members.

'Rejoice and be glad O Virgin Mary, the Lord hath risen indeed. Alleluia!' Happy May – one and all!

Council Shed

The roof has been re-felted and a new coat of paint will be applied within the next few months.

Bus Shelter

The roof re-tiling work should be carried out within the next 3-4 weeks. Once this has been done, we will give it a 'spruce up' and locate a noticeboard in there so that residents living on the West side of the A1065 will have easier access to parish notices. We are also exploring the feasibility of having a mini library in the shelter following a suggestion by a parishioner.

We recently met with a member of FACT to discuss their return to activities post Covid-19 lock down. Once we have received a programme of works we will publish it...they are always looking for volunteers so please contact the Clerk or FACT directly if you are interested.

A group of volunteers recently carried out a litter pick at the Bullock Hills and did a great job, but everyone has a responsibility to keep these beautiful areas free from rubbish and dog walkers need to clear up after their pets. We are looking into the provision of litter and dog bins at the Bullock Hills and have been in communication with Fakenham Town Council and the Raynham Estate.
