Crime Updates (1st to 28th February 2019)

Offence	Numbers	What could this entail
Arson	0	Damage caused as a result of fire.
Anti-Social Behaviour (ASB)	0	Harassment, alarm or distress is caused in a non-crime incident.
Burglary - Business and Community	2	Entry and theft to any building or structure not within the curtilage/ boundary of a residence.
Burglary - Residential	4	Entry and theft to any building within the curtilage/boundary of a residence.
Criminal Damage	11	A person destroys or damages property belonging to someone else.
Domestic	12	Domestic incidents where a crime has not occurred. Parties are aged 16 or over and have been intimate partners or family members regardless of sexuality.
Hate Incident	0	Any incident where a crime has not occurred which the victim, or anyone else, thinks is based on someone's prejudice towards them because of their race, religion, sexual orientation, disability or because they are transgender.
Race or Religious aggravated public fear	0	Any crime determined to have a hate element as per above.
Possession of controlled substance	1	Unlawful possession of a drug classified in class A, B or C.
Possession of weapons	0	Unlawful possession of an article used as a weapon.
Public fear, alarm or distress	3	Public order offences e.g. from a verbal altercation to offences just short of violence.
Robbery	0	Includes a range of offences where force is used, threatened or the victim is put in fear.
Theft from a motor vehicle	2	Any item stolen that was in, on or attached to a motor vehicle.
Theft or unauthorised taking of a motor vehicle	0	Any motor vehicle including those abandoned.
Theft of pedal cycle	0	From a public place, if stolen from a shed or garage this would be a Burglary Residential.
Theft from a person	1	Purse being taken from a handbag, or a mobile phone from a shopping basket.

We are continuing to receive reports from Norfolk residents about telephone cold calls claiming to be from BT.

Calls include a message claiming to be from BT stating your 'internet and landline will be cut off'; calls claiming to be from 'BT Openreach' stating there are 'problems with your router'; calls claiming to be from BT stating they can 'offer you a 35% discount on your bill'

We always advise to be wary of telephone cold calls and the claims made during them. If you receive a suspicious call claiming to be from BT do not give or confirm any personal or financial details. Hang up, wait five minutes and then call BT customer service on 0800 800 150.

If you have received a telephone cold call which you believe to be a scam you can report it to Norfolk Trading Standards via their partners the Citizens Advice consumer helpline on 03454 04 05 06.

Neighbourhood Priorities

- 1. Patrols along A148, A1067, A1065, B1105, B1355, B1454, B1354 and around the surrounding remote villages/locations in the area paying particular attention to farms, building sites, Anglian Water sites.
- 2. Focus on reducing drug supply and usage across the area paying attention to Millennium Park, Fakenham Academy and the NTE in Fakenham.
